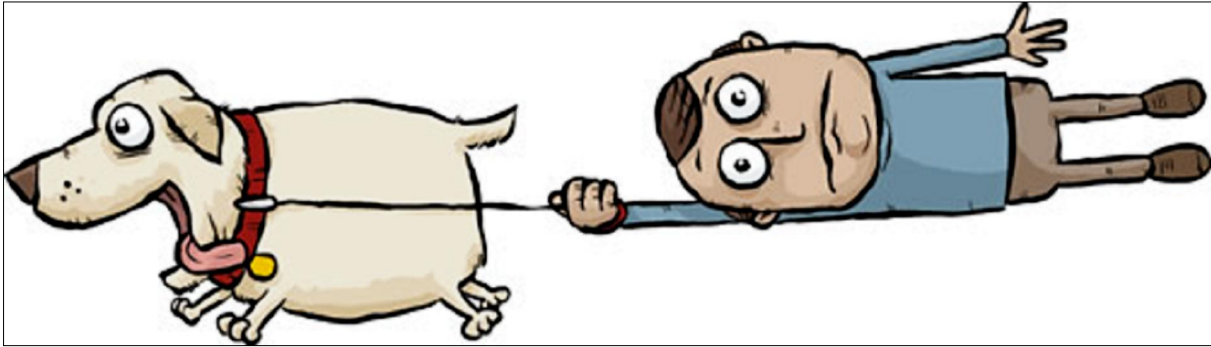


## Code of conduct for owners of dogs on the allotment site



- Individual plot holders are allowed a maximum of 2 dogs on site at any one time.
- Dogs must be controlled by owners so as not to annoy or inconvenience other tenants.
- Dogs must be kept on a short lead at all times when on the allotments site, and must be walked down the centre of any common access areas.
- Dogs are only allowed in the common access areas and the owner's plot.
- Dogs must not be left on site without their owner.
- Plot holders should, out of courtesy, make their neighbours aware of their intention to bring dogs on site.
- Dogs must not be tied at the vehicle gate entrance.
- Dog owners are advised to 'exercise' their dog before coming onto the site and any 'accident' should be cleared up immediately by the owner. Where a dog urinates the owner must wash that area down with water.
- Any plot holder wishing to take advantage of this rule will need to ensure their dog(s) are regularly wormed and vaccinated
- Owners should be aware that rat poison is used on the site (in sealed bait boxes) and their dog should be kept well clear of these
- All dogs brought onto the site are at the owner's risk and are not covered by our insurance policy

*(Please note that dogs are to be allowed onto the allotment site for a 12 month trial period. This will be reviewed at the next AGM.)*
